

1. **COURSE TITLE:** Religion 12: Comparative Christianity
INSTRUCTOR: Rev. David Huebner, Rev. Nathan Sutton
TEXTBOOK: The Holy Bible (N.I.V. or other translation)

2. **COURSE PURPOSE**
The purpose of this course is to equip the students with the tools they need to fulfill their roles as God's people now and after they graduate, particularly as they strive to share their Christian faith with people of different religions and as they move into a new family relationship.

4. **INSTRUCTIONAL STRATEGIES**
 - A. Informational lectures by instructor together with class discussion based on readings and worksheets/study guides.
 - B. Individual and group activities which supplement material covered in class.
 - C. Special guest speakers as available on various topics.
 - D. Videotapes of various topics relating to course material.
 - E. Major assignments include an individual report during the first semester - due before Christmas; a group (paired) presentation about "other religions" during the second semester.
